

(15) For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ --- the Father of Glory --- may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him,

(18) having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which He has called you, what are the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His great might that He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.

(22) And He put all things under His feet and gave Him as head over all things to the Church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.

Think on these things:

- 1) Paul offers a prayer for the Ephesians for two reasons. What are they (v. 15)?

- 2) Who is the “God of our Lord Jesus Christ” (v. 17)?

- 3) This prayer is presented as one LONG sentence running from v. 15 to v. 21, making it challenging to dissect. Let’s see what Paul asks God for to benefit the people of this church by the phrases in these verses:

5) Do you desire any of these things personally? If so, which one(s)?

6) After the Father raised Jesus from the dead --- and Jesus remained with His disciples 40 days --- where did Jesus go (v. 20)? What is the significance of this?

7) Who “answers” to Jesus? For how long (vs. 21-22)?

8) What is the relationship of God’s “church” to Jesus (v. 23)? By the way, this church is comprised of “we” who believe! (Believers are NOT the covenant people; that special relationship belongs to the Jews.)
